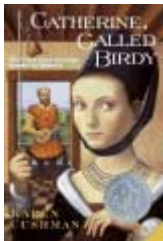


## **Book of a Thousand Days**

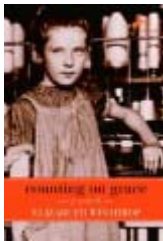


## **Catherine, Called Birdy**

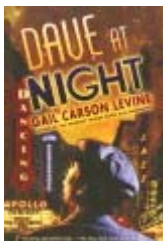


## **Counting on Grace**

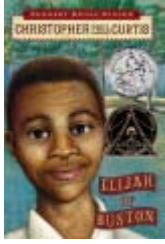


## **Dave at Night**

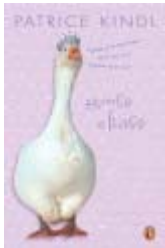


## **Firegirl**

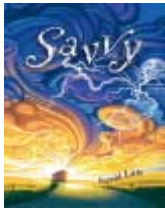


## **Rapunzel's Revenge**

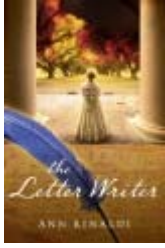


## **Six Innings: A Game in the Life**

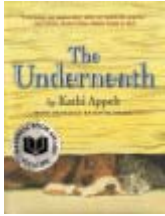


### **The Letter Writer**

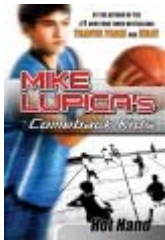
### **Waiting for Normal**

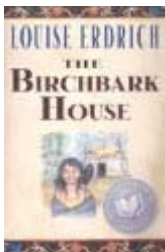
